

Neonatal Transfer Service

The team who come to transfer your baby will introduce themselves to you and explain how they will transfer your baby.

They are a specialist team trained to care for sick newborn and premature babies. There will be a Doctor/ ANNP, Neonatal Nurse and an Ambulance Driver, all of which are specially trained in neonatal transport.

The ambulance carrying your baby will have all the necessary specialist equipment to continue your baby's care and ensure their safe transfer to your local neonatal unit.

Visiting for siblings and others

We have an open visiting policy. Visitors must be over the age of 16 years and be accompanied by the baby's parent/carer. When brining visitors please avoid ward rounds and nursing handovers. There is a maximum of 3 at a cot side.

Facilities & Accommodation for parents

There is a range of facilities for parents including a breast-milk expressing room, a sitting room, a quiet room and a flat for rooming-in before discharge.

We can provide accommodation, either on neonatal unit or Ronald McDonald House. We prioritise according to babies condition and distance travelled.
